



























GLP CREW – Please join me in welcoming Anthony Luttman to the Dana Team!



Clayton also used this as a way to provide a better understanding of the rigorous testing that our reman exchange units go through and level of detail performed to make sure every unit that gets shipped out, is tested to the high standard synonymous with GL Power.






When we weren't busy in the shop, doing startups, or upfits...we were doing R&R work!

Cayman Islands Coast Guard

Hamilton Jet forwarded us this customer's contact info for an initial spare parts purchase. Their head of fleet maintenance worked with Omar Betancourt for some basic spares, but they also commented about a leak at the vessel's transom seals (initially on the port jet) but both units were now seeping water.



Limited scheduling didn't allow us to dispatch a tech, but I went to the Cayman Islands for 2 days and met with the engineering staff and visually inspected both jets. It was obvious of a seal or o ring breach at the transom housing, so we quoted a service tech to return to the island and work with their service





Steve Meenaghan arrived on the island and worked with the 3 engineers for a full external teardown, removing the buckets, nozzles and tailpiece assemblies. The transom o rings were both flattened allowing water to bypass during operation – the seats were cleaned, new o rings installed, and applicable HJ approved sealant used to reassemble the jet externals.





Cayman Islands Coast Guard Sea Trial





Steve Meenaghan was present for sea trial and rode onboard as the vessel achieved over 36 knots prior to the seas being a bit choppy.

The Coast Guard was very happy with the results, and we modified their spare parts order to reflect the basic maintenance spares they need going forward.

Their engineers also stated the CICG is coordinating with the local police and customs for a new boat and the CG is recommending another HJ vessel based on "local" support.

The sea trial photos don't show the actual speeds; we do have a 38 second video if anyone is interested!!







Toggmac - Kingston Jamaica

Omar Betancourt spoke with this boat captain back in February about replacing their EC251 control system (circa 2001). Based on the engine and gear info, a Glendinning system was the optimal way to upgrade his controls and mitigate any changes to his engines or gears.

The replacement system sold in March; the captain called us mid-May asking for technical assistance in terminating the wiring for sea trial. Several calls back and forth proved the captain wasn't comfortable in doing this work, so we dispatched our lead tech to Kingston for assistance/completion.



Steve Meenaghan just returned from the Cayman Islands, so it was unpack/repack/get back on the plane!!! Vessel location was close to the airport and through some troubleshooting with Glendinning, Steve ID'ed some issues with the vessel that require our return in the next 1-2 weeks.


