"You CAN teach an old dog new tricks"



AIST is now the largest annual iron- and steel-related technology conference in the world. The AISTech Exposition features 500+ global vendors.










GLP received a call that the Maid of the Mist was having problems with their Veth Control System upon Spring Start Up. Billy Peele and I met a service engineer from Veth Factory and traveled to the boat in Niagara Falls, NY.

The two newest Maid of the Mist boats are all electric with ABB battery management systems and Veth L Drive Thrusters and Veth Propulsion Controls.

Working with the Veth Factory we replaced one of the frequency drive controls that was suspected of causing the issues and learned that the control panels were not heated for off season storagethe LED screens on the frequency drive's displays had actually frozen during winter storage.





After making repairs we made several simulated trips to the falls with charging cycles in between. The boat is able to charge 10% of battery capacity in 7 minutes.
















Everyone is expected to pull their weight here in Chesapeake!


